Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2014

#### ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

The company carried out the following administrative matters:

- Renewal of Company Public & Directors Liability Insurance;
- Appointment of a lawyer to develop a "licence" to be used as a legal "vehicle" to construct footpaths through the Coishletter woodlands and Edinbane Common Grazing;
- Provision of a forum for community liaison regarding current proposal by Highland Council to close Edinbane Primary school;
- Management of Playpark and War memorial construction and opening events;
- The purchase of the "Gifted Pairc" from Highland Council for £1.00;
- Consideration of funding application and participation in development of North West Skye Sports & Wellness Hub, ECC was approached with a request for support for "revenue funding for the project, Directors conducted a membership pole as the request had serious "open ended" implications for any funders. The Membership opted not to support the project;
- Two Directors attended a Community Land Seminar held in Portree; and
- Organised the AGM, Bonfire, fireworks and ceilidh

## Socio economic impact survey of Edinbane Windfarm

A sixth year pupil at Portree High School presented the findings of his Geography Higher research project into the socio economic impact of the windfarm to Directors. Results from a survey of 47 residents containing a range of questions that included:

- 'Has Edinbane benefitted from the windfarm?' 67% agreed, 28% strongly agreed and 5% disagreed (there was no apparent shareholder / crofter bias in the responses);
- 'Have the turbines improved the view?' 35% responded that they weren't bothered and 67% agreed that they had improved the view; and
- What other benefits have arisen from the windfarm?' sixteen differing responses were received the main benefits
  mentioned included; the playpark, war memorial, improved access, cohesive effect on the community. 21% of
  respondents cited no benefits suggesting a gap in local awareness regarding the work of ECC.

The website www.edinbanecommunitycompany.org was maintained during the year, providing a transparent window on Company management together with access to funding application forms, minutes and funding decisions.

During the financial year 2013/2014 the Company received £56,574 from Vattenfall.

During the financial year 2013/2014 the Company awarded a total of £88,205.23 worth of project expenditure as detailed in Appendix 1.

During the financial year 2013 /2014 the Company spent £ 2,464 on village maintenance.

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Accounting convention**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

#### **Incoming resources**

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

## Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
